## SOCIAL PROGRAM

### ALHAMBRA TOUR

The visit will begin in the Alhambra, the construction of which was begun by the founder of the nasrid dynasty Mohammed Ibn Alhamar, in the XI century on the red hill known as assabic, which overlooks Granada. First the fortress or Alcazaba was built, and subsequently, the royal palace and the highest part of the Alhambra which became the court member residence. Later on, Charles V commissioned a palace to be built on the same site. we shall visit the most important halls and courtyards of the Alhambra including the «Patio de los arrayanes» (myrtle courtyard), the «Patio de los leones» (Lion Courtyard), the «Salon de los embajadores» (Ambassador's Hall), and the «Sala de los abencerrajes», which was the scene of a tragic legend. In addition, we shall also visit the Alcazaba or fortress, the royal baths, the partial gardens and the palace of Charles V.

The visit will then continue to the Generalife, situated next to the Alhambra, and which was a place of leisure and recreation for the Moorish kings of Granada. The Generalife contains splendid gardens which many varied types of flowers and fountains, described by a poet «hidden water weeps». The visit includes two further courtyards the «Patio de la acequia» and the «Patio de la sultana».

Visit lasts for 2h 30 min approximately, pick up at the hotel between 9:30 and 10:00 am. Including: official guide (in his/her language), tickets and transport with escort guide going/return from the hotel (within a radius of 15 km from city-centre).

### ALPUJARRA TOUR

This excursion not only includes interesting cultural elements, but is also recommended for who are interested in nature and landscape, since it takes in the area from the Sierra Nevada mountains on the Mediterranean. The climate variety here has made this one of the most important areas in Europe for botanists, because of the variety of species to be found. We must also take into account the important Moorish cultural heritage, the characteristic landscape made up of small white villages with their earthen, flat-roofed houses, and their small terraces cut into the mountainside for farming, some of which are over 2,000 metres above sea level. all of these aspects combine to make a visit to this unique area a must.

We will visit Lanjaron a famous spa town with its medical waters, and Orgiva, the central town of this mountainous region known as the Alpujarra. In addition to a series of picturesque villages such as Carataunas, Pampaneira, Pitres, Portugos



with its «Fuente Agría» or bitter water spring, and Trevelez, the highest village in Spain. We shall then we will continue through Bubion to Capilleira, typical lunch will be served.

Visit lasts for 8h approximately, pick up at the hotel between 8:30 and 9:00 am. Including: guide (in Spanish and/or English), tickets and transport going/return from the hotel (within a radius of 15 km from city-centre).

### **GRANADA HISTORICAL TOUR**

We shall begin our visit at the Royal Chapel, built in flamboyant gothic style by the catholic monarchs, and in which their mausoleum and that of their children Felipe «El Hermoso» and Juana «La Loca» is to be found. Along side the chapel is the cathedral, which is considered to be the first renaissance church in Spain.

The excursion will continue with a panoramic trip through the main street of Granada «Reyes Católicos», Gran Vía, and Hospital Real (royal hospital), founded by the catholic monarchs in 1504 next to the «Jardines del Triunfo». We shall arrive to the carthusian monastery a baroque masterpiece whose constructor began in 1505 and lasted three centuries, and of which the holy of hollies and the vestry are the most not worthy aspects. From there we shall go on the old moorish quarter of the Albaycin, where we shall wind through the narrow streets until we reach the «Mirador de san Nicolás», a vantage point which offers magnificent views of the Alhambra, Granada and Sierra Nevada.

Then well arrive to the Sacromonte o typical quarter where the gypsy population is living in caves, well visit one of the most representative, where a drink will be served.

Visit lasts for 2h 30min approximately, pick up at the hotel between 16:15 and 16:45. Including: guide (in Spanish and/or English), tickets and transport with escort guide going/return from the hotel (within a radius of 15 km from city-centre).

### **COSTA TROPICAL AND NERJA'S CAVE**

The granadine coast boasts a mild climate with a mean temperature of 18 degrees centigrade, thus enabling the farming of custard apples, papaya, advocado, sugar cane. Motril is an important fishing & commercial port serving the region. Turning in the direction towards Málaga, we come accross Salobreña, a white town perched on a hill and crowned by an acient arab castle from where the

panoramic views of the surrounding fertile plain and beaches can be admired. Almuñecar is the tourist haven along the coast, ancient city of the Phoenicians, and boasts important monuments: sites in the Majuelo park, the castle of San Miguel and a beautiful old quarter where lunch will be served. The caves of Nerja are visited in the afternoon with their extensive grottoes with archaeological remains, a popular venue for concerts.

Visit lasts for 8h approximately, pick up at the hotel between 8:30 and 9:00 am. Including: guide (in Spanish and/or English) and transport going/return from the hotel ( within a radius of 15 km from city-centre).

The cave «La Canastera» specialises in Zambra that is normally performed by a gypsy family. The performance represents the rich tradition of gypsy folklore. The Zambra is generally happy, enchanting and full of the abundant grace exuded by the gypsies.
